## CORRECTION: I-10 Resurfacing from Chaffee Road to I-295 to Begin in Late April

Resurfacing on I-10 from First Coast Expressway to Nassau County line to begin later this spring

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Crews will begin resurfacing I-10 from Chaffee Road to I-295 in late April as the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is prioritizing the corridor to improve conditions.

The resurfacing project will improve roadway conditions, smoothing uneven surfaces and promote safety through enhanced lane markings. Additionally, motorists will experience a more comfortable drive, reduced roadway noise and a more durable roadway for years to come. The project will also include updated highway signage, improved drainage and other incidental construction.

Throughout construction drivers will experience lane closures and see a lowered speed limit to promote safety through the construction zone.

Anderson Columbia Co. Inc, was awarded the \$26 million project and is expected to complete the project in mid-2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

A future project to resurface I-10 between the Nassau County line and the First Coast Expressway (SR 23) is expected to begin in late spring. A separate press release will be distributed at that time.
