
### Detour Scheduled on County Road 20A Next Week for Reconstruction Work in Hawthorne

**HAWTHORNE, Fla.** – As part of the widening improvements on State Road 20 from the Putnam County line to SW 56th Avenue, County Road 20A will be temporarily closed at State Road 20 Monday, January 11 through Friday, January 15, weather and schedule permitting. The temporary closure is necessary to safely complete roadway reconstruction work.

Traffic will detour via County Road 21 south to County Road 20A (map below).

Anderson Columbia Co. Inc. is estimated to complete the \$49 million improvements by late 2022, weather and schedule permitting.
