Detours Planned Next Week for Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway (SR 115) ITS Improvements

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements project on Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway (State Road 115) from Boulevard Street to Beach Boulevard, daytime detours are scheduled next week for the removal of surface casing from a dynamic message sign (DMS) structure.

Haines Street between East 15th Street and East 13th Street will be closed Monday, Oct. 21 through Friday, Oct. 25 between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Drivers seeking to travel northbound on Haines Street during the closure will head north on Haines Street, right onto 13th Street, left onto Buckman Street, left onto 15th Street and right onto Haines Street.

Drivers seeking to travel south on Haines Street will continue south on Haines Street, left onto 15th Street, right onto Buckman Street, right onto 13th Street and left onto Haines Street.

Chinchor Electric began the \$7.9 million Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements in September 2023 and is estimated to complete the work by early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
