

### Detours Planned Next Week for State Road 211 Intersection Improvements

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation will implement detours next week as part of the State Road 211 (St. Johns Avenue) from Herschel Street to Canterbury Street Intersection Improvements Project.

#### State Road 211 (St. Johns Avenue) at Herschel Street Detour:

- Monday, April 18 through Thursday, April 21, State Road 211 at Herschel Street is expected to be closed daily between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. for construction activities. Traffic will be detoured to San Juan Avenue to Roosevelt Boulevard and Edgewood Avenue South. Flagging operations will be in place during the daytime closures.
- Beginning Thursday, April 21 at 7 a.m. until Sunday, April 24 at 5 a.m., St. Johns Avenue at Herschel Street will be closed to traffic from Melrose Avenue to Canterbury Avenue. Traffic will be detoured to San Juan Avenue to Roosevelt Boulevard and Edgewood Avenue South.



#### Notable:

- Residents in the area may notice temporary electrical outages Friday, April 22 while JEA crews prepare for removal of the traffic signal at State Road 211 and Woodmere Street.
