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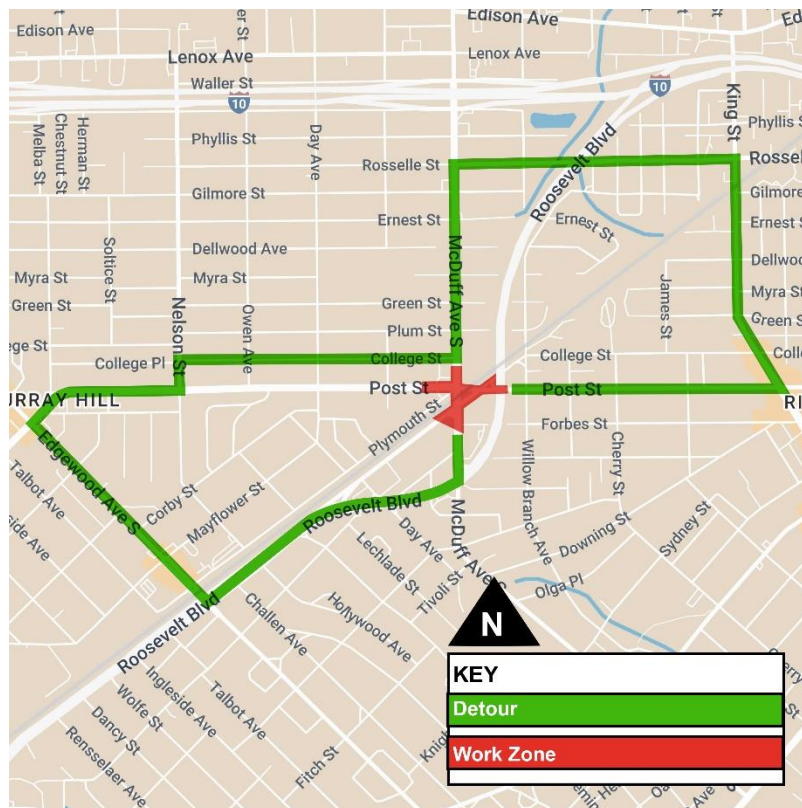
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Extended Detour of Post Street and McDuff Avenue at Old Roosevelt Boulevard Scheduled to Begin June 2

DUVAL COUNTY, Fla. – The Post Street (SR 228) from Cassat Avenue (SR 111) to Old Roosevelt Boulevard resurfacing and rail safety project is scheduled to begin this month. As part of rail safety improvements, an extended detour of Post Street and McDuff Avenue at Old Roosevelt Boulevard is necessary to perform roundabout and railroad track construction safely. This intersection will close on Monday, June 2, and remain closed for approximately three months, unforeseen circumstances permitting.

During the closure, drivers will use King Steet, Roselle Street, College Street, Nelson Street, Edgewood Avenue and Roosevelt Boulevard respectively. The detour route is shown on the map provided below.



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Watson Civil Construction is estimated to complete the \$6.5 million resurfacing and rail safety project by summer 2026, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
