FDOT Shifting Traffic onto New Lanes of County Road 218 Bridge

MIDDLEBURG, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will shift traffic on County Road 218 eastbound onto new lanes of the County Road 218 bridge beginning Sunday, August 22 at 6 p.m.

Crews will begin shifting eastbound drivers to the left, just east of the Walgreens parking lot, onto lanes of the new County Road 218 bridge. This shift will allow crews to close the eastbound lanes to begin construction of the other half of the new bridge.



FDOT hired Sacyr to complete this \$16.4 million project in spring 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
