## FDOT to Host Construction Open House June 2 to Discuss U.S. 1 Resurfacing Improvements in St. Augustine

**ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a hybrid construction open house for a resurfacing and concrete rehabilitation project on U.S. 1 (State Road 5) from State Road 207 to the St. Augustine City Gates set to begin in June 2021.

The hybrid construction open house will be held Wednesday, June 2, from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Citizens may participate online at <u>nflroads.com/COH</u> or by phone at (562) 247-8422, access code 904-001-691. Citizens who are unable to participate virtually may attend the open house in person at the St. Johns County Administrative Auditorium located at 500 San Sebastian View, St. Augustine, FL 32084.

Those interested in attending in person can drop by anytime between 4 and 6 p.m. to learn more about the project including timeframe, construction activities, traffic impacts and other details. Project staff will be available during this time to answer questions. This is an informal open house and no presentation is scheduled.

This improvement project will include roadway paving and concrete rehabilitation work. Construction crews will also be removing on-street parking along U.S. 1 from State Road 207 to the St. Augustine City Gates to install buffered bicycle lanes. To safely complete this work, daytime and nighttime lane closures will be necessary.

Kiewit Infrastructure South Company is estimated to complete the \$15 million improvements by late summer 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
