

FDOT to Host March 9 Open House for Arlington Expressway Resurfacing Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a construction open house for the Arlington Expressway (State Road 115) resurfacing project Thursday, March 9 at Arlington Congregational Church, 431 University Boulevard North. The informal open house will give the public the opportunity to learn about the upcoming project and discuss details with FDOT staff and engineers.

Interested citizens may drop by anytime between 4 and 6 p.m. to view project maps and talk with the project team. The open house will also be accessible online at nflroads.com/vph or by phone at (562) 247-8422, access code 118-874-342.

The project includes milling and resurfacing the expressway, service roads and the Red Bay Branch bridges, removal of the Colcord Avenue ramp, signage and pavement marking improvements and pedestrian safety upgrades. The \$26 million project is scheduled to begin in April and be completed in fall 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
