## FDOT to Host Public Meeting Next Week for Proposed Mayport Road Safety Improvements

**ATLANTIC BEACH, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a public meeting to discuss proposed safety improvements on Mayport Road (State Road A1A) from Atlantic Boulevard (State Road 10) to Dutton Island Road West.

FDOT proposes the following improvements to Mayport Road:

- Milling and resurfacing from Atlantic Boulevard to Dutton Island Road West
- Signalized intersection improvements
- Lane repurposing
- Southbound bike lane construction
- Northbound sidewalk widening

A virtual public meeting will be held Monday, Dec. 2, with an informal open house from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m. and a formal presentation and public comment period beginning at 6 p.m. Information about participation is available at www.nflroads.com/VPH.

An in-person meeting will be held Dec. 4 at Atlantic Beach City Hall, 800 Seminole Rd., Atlantic Beach, FL 32233. An informal open house will be held from 4:30 p.m. to 6 p.m., with a formal presentation and public comment period beginning at 6 p.m.

Public meetings provide the public with an opportunity to express their views on the project, its potential for impact and other related matters. All participants, regardless of the platform they choose, will receive the same information on the proposed project and all comments received in-person, virtually, or electronically will be given equal consideration.
