FDOT to Host Public Meetings for Proposed Improvements to State Road 24 in Waldo

Public comment period at 6 p.m.

WALDO, Fla – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a Hybrid Public meeting to discuss the proposed improvements for State Road 24 (Waldo Road) Resurfacing/Lane Repurposing Project from west of Northeast 141st Drive to U.S. 301 in Alachua, County, Florida.
