### **FDOT to host hybrid public hearing for tentative five-year work program**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Florida's Turnpike Enterprise will hold a public hearing for the tentative Five-Year Work Program Thursday, January 14 with an open house period between 4:30 p.m. and 6 p.m. There will be a brief overview of the work program development process at 6 p.m. followed by a public comment period. Department staff will be available to respond to questions or concerns for all counties in District Two.

The hearing will take place both virtually and in-person at the FDOT Urban Office Training Center located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204. Project documents and information on how to participate online are available at [www.NFLRoads.com/VPH](http://www.NFLRoads.com/VPH).

All participants, regardless of the platform they choose, will participate in the same live hearing.
