FDOT to host open house for Hammond Boulevard/I-10 interchange landscaping project

Jacksonville – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is hosting the second of two open houses to share information with the community for the proposed landscaping project at the newly constructed interchange at Hammond Boulevard and I-10.

The open house is Monday, November 6, from 4:30-6:30 p.m. at Trinity Baptist Church, 800 Hammond Boulevard, in the Connections Plaza, Building 11, Jacksonville, Florida 32221.

Those interested can drop by anytime between 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. to learn more about the landscaping project and provide feedback to project staff. The landscaping design team will be available to answer questions and discuss the landscaping improvements proposed for the interchange. This is an informal open house and no presentation is scheduled. To provide comments electronically, send email to jan.herbst@dot.state.fl.us.

The current proposal for this \$1 million landscaping project includes plantings of numerous species of trees and shrubs, installing fountains in two ponds, irrigation and other incidental work relating to the overall aesthetics of the western approach to Jacksonville from the I-10 corridor. The project is now preparing to go into final design, with construction expected to start in late 2018.

The landscaping project has been developed as a concept through District Two's FDOTree program, a District Two initiative created to inform and educate the public about the Florida Department of Transportation's Northeast Florida landscaping programs.
