### **I-10 Westbound Single Lane Closure and Southbound U.S. 301 Exit Ramp Detour on Thursday Night**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of FDOT’s I-10 and U.S. 301 Improvements project, westbound I-10 between Yellow Water Road and U.S. 301 will have a single-lane closure and the exit ramp onto southbound U.S. 301 will be closed Thursday night.

Traffic wanting to take southbound U.S. 301 will be detoured onto the northbound U.S. 301 ramp where traffic control officers will be on-site to direct traffic. The overnight closures are needed to adjust traffic control devices as part of the recently completed traffic shift on the southbound ramp. This lane closure and ramp closure will be in place for construction activities from 11 p.m. Thursday, June 22 to 5 a.m. Friday, June 23, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Superior Construction Company began the \$65 million interchange improvement project in February 2016 and is estimated to complete the work this summer, weather and schedule permitting.
