Long-term Detour Planned at the Arlington Expressway South Service Road Bridge Over Red Bay Branch

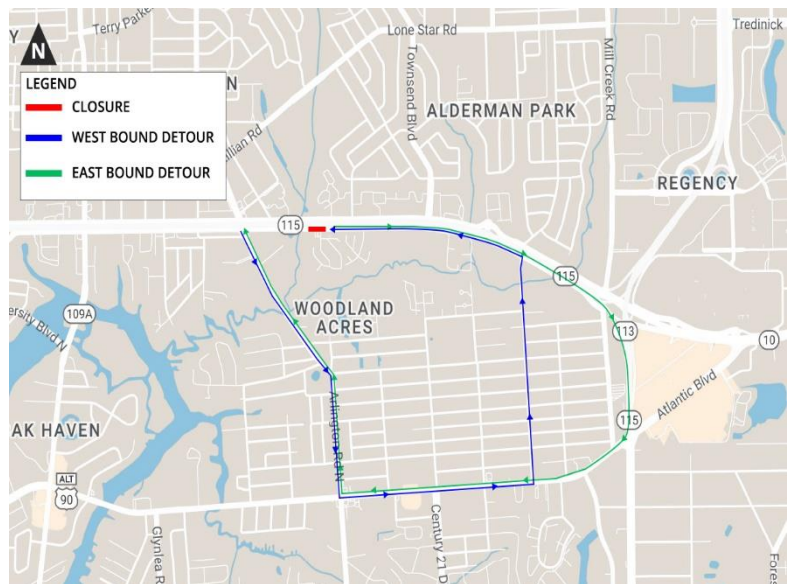
JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of a resurfacing project on Arlington Expressway (State Road 115) from Mathews Bridge to Southside Boulevard, a detour of the Arlington Expressway South Service Road bridge over Red Bay Branch is expected to begin early this month and continue through January 2024 while crews perform bridge construction operations. During the closure, traffic will be detoured as follows:

Detour to Red Bay Apartments:

Drivers will detour via southbound Arlington Road north, eastbound Atlantic Boulevard, northbound Century Street, and westbound onto South Service Road to access Red Bay Apartments.

Detour to Arlington Expressway:

Drivers will detour via eastbound South Service Road, southbound Southside Boulevard, westbound Atlantic Boulevard, northbound Arlington Road to access the Arlington Expressway. The Arlington Expressway will remain open to traffic in both directions.



Superior Construction is expected to complete the \$26 million project in summer 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
