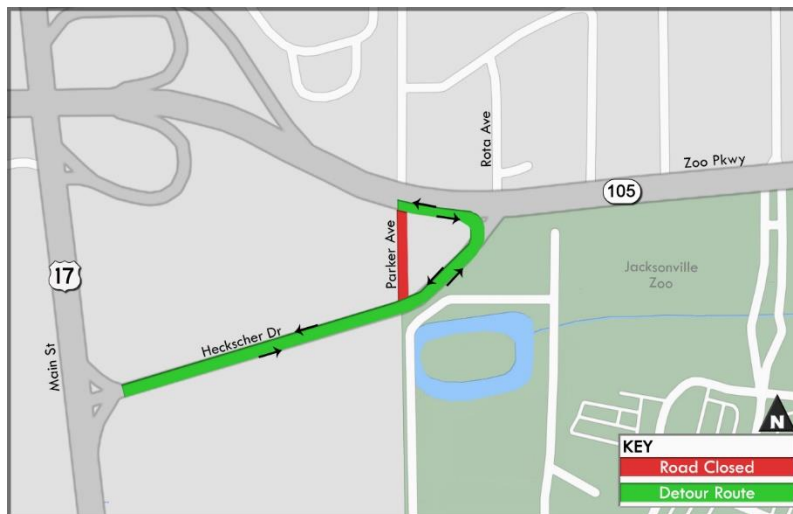

### Main Street at Zoo Parkway Overnight Ramp and Road Closures Scheduled September 13 through September 17

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Ramps at the Main Street (U.S. 17) and Zoo Parkway interchange and Parker Avenue at Heckscher Drive (State Road 105) will close from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. starting Monday, September 13 through Thursday, September 16, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The closures are needed for construction related to the Zoo Parkway resurfacing and improvement project.

**Monday, September 13:** Parker Avenue from Zoo Parkway to Heckscher Drive/Zoo Parkway Connector will close at 7 p.m. and reopen by 6 a.m. Tuesday. Traffic will detour via Heckscher Drive and Zoo Parkway from U.S. 17 or Zoo Parkway. (Closure and detour shown in Map 1 below.)

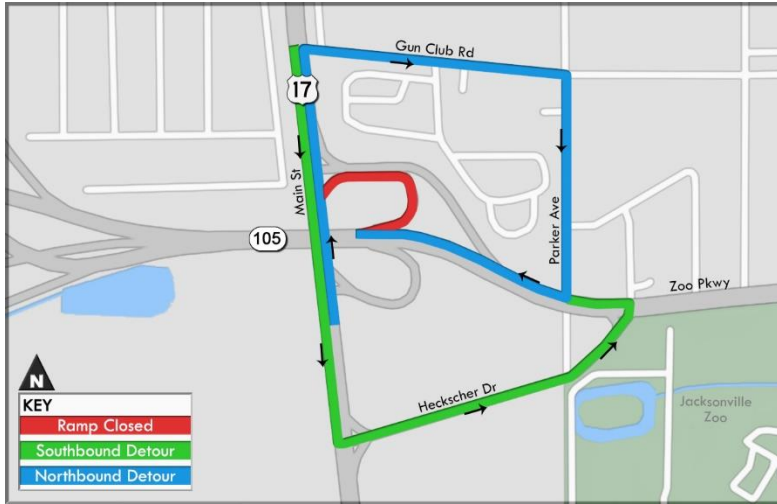

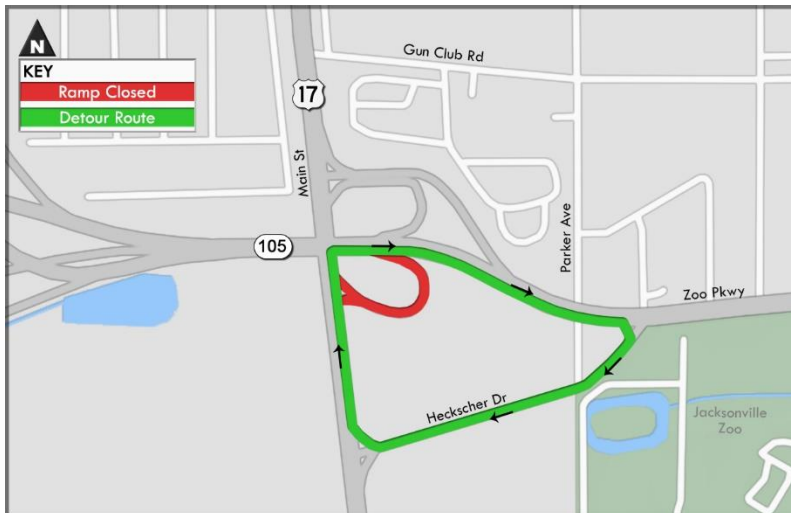
