New Traffic Pattern on Eastbound Butler Boulevard Ramp to San Pablo Road to Begin June 22

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Beginning Tuesday, June 22, traffic on the ramp from eastbound Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) to San Pablo Road will be shifted to the newly-constructed travel lanes just south of the existing lanes.

FDOT hired Watson Civil Construction to complete this \$12 million project, which includes construction of a diverging diamond interchange at San Pablo Road and Butler Boulevard, in spring of 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
