Nighttime Detour and Traffic Pacing Operations Along I-10 Planned for Thursday Night

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT's I-10 from I-295 to I-95 widening project, I-10 west will be detoured and I-10 east will see traffic pacing operations Thursday, December 2 from 10 p.m. until 3 a.m. while crews perform overhead utility work, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

I-10 Eastbound Pacing Operations: Drivers can expect increased traffic between Blair Road and Edgewood Avenue due to traffic pacing operations. Drivers can also expect to see law enforcement assisting with these operations.

Traffic pacing is a traffic control technique used to slow but not stop traffic to facilitate short duration work operations without an extensive detour or diversion. Marked law enforcement vehicles will slow the traffic to safely move them through the corridor without requiring a detour.

I-10 West Detour: Drivers will be detoured at the Luna Street exit, right on Luna Street, left on Highway Avenue and left on Lane Avenue to reconnect with I-10.

FDOT hired Superior Construction to complete this \$174.5 million project in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
