Nighttime Westbound Lane Closures Planned March 20, 21, and 24-27 on J.T. Butler Boulevard at the Intracoastal Waterway Bridge

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of a bridge improvement project on J.T. Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) at the Intracoastal Waterway, nightly westbound lane closures are planned Wednesday, March 20, Thursday, March 21, and Sunday, March 24 through Wednesday, March 27. Lane closures will be in place nightly from 10:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. the following morning, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Oceanik.US, Inc. was selected to complete the \$1.7 million project. The bridge improvements consist of installation of galvanic pile jackets for select piles and other incidental construction on J.T. Butler Boulevard. Completion is estimated in Fall 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
