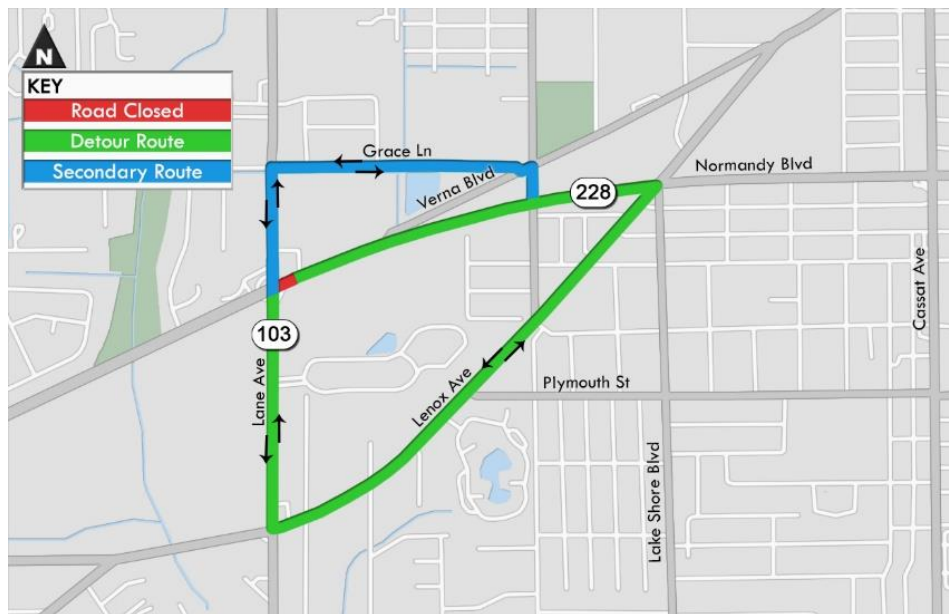

### Overnight Closures Planned at Normandy Boulevard, Lane Avenue Intersection Sunday and Monday

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of FDOT’s Lane Avenue resurfacing project, a section of Normandy Boulevard east of the intersection with Lane Avenue will be closed for overnight utility work from 8 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. Sunday, June 5 and Monday, June 6, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

**Eastbound Normandy Boulevard Traffic:** Drivers will turn right onto Lane Avenue, left onto Lenox Avenue and back to Normandy Boulevard.

**Westbound Normandy Boulevard Traffic:** Drivers will turn left onto Lenox Avenue, right onto Lane Avenue and onto Normandy Boulevard (or straight to access I-10).



Anderson Columbia, Co., Inc. is expected to complete this \$7.9 million improvement project in spring 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
