Overnight Closures of I-295/Beach Boulevard Ramps Planned Sept. 8-12

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the widening and resurfacing improvement project on I-295 from J.T. Butler Boulevard (SR 202) to Beach Boulevard (SR 212), overnight ramp closures are planned Sunday, Sept. 8 to Thursday, Sept. 12, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Ramp closures will begin at 10 p.m. and end by 5 a.m. the following morning.

I-295 South exit ramp to Town Center Parkway/I-295 South on-ramp from Beach Boulevard closed: Drivers will detour via westbound Beach Boulevard, southbound St. Johns Bluff Road and eastbound Town Center Parkway to access the I-295 southbound on-ramp.

I-295 North exit ramp to Beach Boulevard/I-295 North on-ramp from UNF Drive closed: Drivers will detour via westbound Town Center Parkway, northbound St. Johns Bluff Road and eastbound Beach boulevard to access the I-295 northbound on-ramp.

Hubbard Construction Company, Inc. is expected to complete the \$19 million improvement project in late 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
