### Overnight Closures on I-10 from State Road 23 to U.S. 301 Scheduled July 21 and July 22

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The westbound lanes of I-10 from State Road 23 (First Coast Expressway) to U.S. 301 are scheduled to close overnight Wednesday, July 21 and Thursday, July 22 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. for work related to the Yellow Water Road Bridge replacement project.

Traffic will detour to Beaver Street (U.S. 90) west via the Exit 350 ramp and continue to the U.S. 301 ramp back to I-10 West (shown in the map below).
