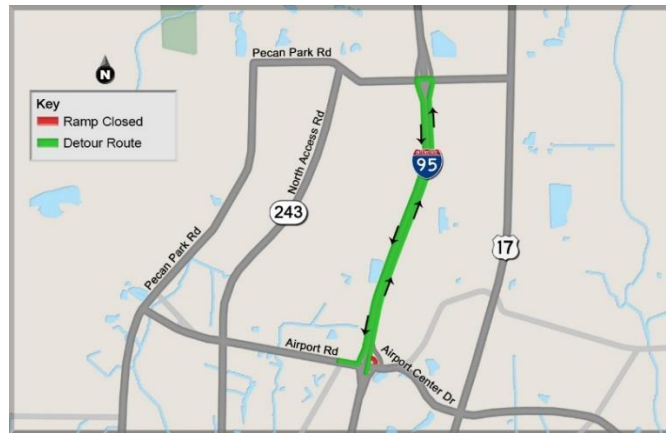

Overnight Detour Starting Sunday on I-295 North Interchange Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will implement an overnight detour on the I-95 northbound exit ramp to Airport Road starting Sunday, November 1 through Thursday, November 5 as part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project. The I-95 northbound exit ramp to Airport Road is expected to be closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. nightly.

As shown in the map below, drivers attempting to exit onto Airport Road will be detoured north to the Pecan Park exit onto I-95 southbound where they can access Airport Road.



This work is part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project that includes a new collector-distributor system, auxiliary lanes and ramp improvements. The interchange is part of an important corridor to promote economic growth and development in the region.

FDOT selected Archer Western to complete this \$176.8 million project in fall 2021, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
