## Overnight Detours Planned Next Week at I-95 Ramps to and from State Road 16 and State Road 207

New I-95 North on-ramp lane from State Road 16 opens overnight April 7

**ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla.** – As part of resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, closures of the State Road 16 and State Road 207 exit and entry ramps from I-95 are necessary for paving and widening work to be completed.

- The I-95 South exit ramp to State Road 16 will close nightly at 8 p.m. Tuesday, April 9 and Wednesday, April 10 and reopen by 6 a.m. the following mornings.
- The I-95 South on-ramp from State Road 207 will close at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 11 and reopen by 1 a.m. the following morning.
- The I-95 North exit ramp to State Road 207 closure will then proceed immediately after, scheduled to close at 1 a.m. and reopen by 6 a.m. Friday, April 12.

During the closures, drivers on I-95 South seeking to access State Road 16 will exit at State Road 207 and use I-95 North to access State Road 16. Drivers on State Road 207 seeking to access I-95 South will use I-95 North and exit at State Road 16 to access I-95 South. Drivers on I-95 North seeking to access State Road 207 will exit at State Road 16 and use I-95 South to access State Road 207. Motorists are encouraged to use caution in the area and follow posted detour signs.

Anderson Columbia Co. Inc. is estimated to complete the \$31 million resurfacing improvements by early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
