Overnight Detours Planned Next Week at the State Road 16 Ramp to I-95 South

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – As part of resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, closures of the State Road 16 ramp to I-95 South are necessary for maintenance work to be completed safely. The ramp closures are scheduled overnight Wednesday, Sept. 18 and Thursday, Sept. 19 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

During the closures, drivers on State Road 16 seeking to access I-95 South will use I-95 North and exit at International Golf Parkway to access I-95 South.

Drivers are encouraged to use caution in the area and follow posted detour signs at these times. Anderson Columbia Co. Inc. is estimated to complete the \$31 million resurfacing improvements by early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
