## Overnight Detours Planned Sunday and Monday at I-95 and State Road 207 Interchange

**ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla.** – As part of resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, overnight closures of the State Road 207 exit and entry ramps from I-95 are necessary for paving work to be completed.

**Sunday, June 18:** The I-95 North exit and entry ramps at State Road 207 will close at 8 p.m. Sunday, June 18 and reopen by 6 a.m. Monday, June 19. Motorists on State Road 207 will be detoured to I-95 South to State Road 206 to access I-95 North. Northbound I-95 motorists will be detoured to exit at State Road 16 and use I-95 South to access State Road 207.

**Monday, June 19:** The I-95 South exit and entry ramps at State Road 207 will close at 8 p.m. Monday, June 19 and reopen by 6 a.m. Tuesday, June 20. Motorists on State Road 207 will be detoured to I-95 North to State Road 16 to access I-95 South. Southbound I-95 motorists will be detoured to exit at State Road 206 and use I-95 North to access State Road 207.

Anderson Columbia Co. Inc. is estimated to complete the \$31 million resurfacing improvements by summer 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
