Overnight Detours of Southside Boulevard (State Road 115) Exit Ramp from I-95 North Scheduled Next Week

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of resurfacing improvements on Southside Boulevard (State Road 115) from Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) to U.S. 1 (Philips Highway), a detour of the Southside Boulevard northbound and southbound exit ramps from I-95 North are scheduled next week. A detour for the Southside Boulevard southbound exit ramp will occur on Tuesday, March 19 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following morning. A detour for the Southside Boulevard northbound exit ramp will occur on Wednesday, March 20 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following morning.

During the Tuesday night detour, drivers on I-95 north seeking to access Southside Boulevard southbound will detour onto Southside Boulevard northbound and make a U-Turn. During the Wednesday night detour, drivers on I-95 north seeking to access Southside Boulevard northbound will detour onto Southside Boulevard southbound and make a U-Turn. Motorists are encouraged to use caution in the area and follow posted detour signs.

Preferred Materials, Inc. is estimated to complete the \$29 million resurfacing and intersection improvements by summer 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
