## Overnight Detours on I-295 North Interchange Project Start Sunday

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project, the Florida Department of Transportation will implement detours within project limits starting this Sunday, May 2, weather and schedule permitting.

Sunday, May 2 through Tuesday, May 4 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., crews will detour the I-95 southbound ramp onto I-295 westbound. As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured onto I-295 eastbound to the U.S. 17 exit where they can access I-295 westbound.



The I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project includes a new collector-distributor system, auxiliary lanes and ramp improvements. The interchange is part of an important corridor to promote economic growth and development in the region.
