Overnight Directional Closures of Blanding Boulevard Planned Aug. 19-22 for First Coast Expressway Work

CLAY COUNTY, Fla. – As part of First Coast Expressway construction, overnight directional closures of Blanding Boulevard (State Road 21) are planned Monday, Aug. 19 through Thursday, Aug. 22 for removal of bridge overhangs, drainage pipe installation and existing signal bracket removal, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Northbound Blanding Boulevard from just south of the First Coast Expressway (State Road 23) to Baxley Road will close nightly at 11 p.m. Monday, Aug. 19 through Wednesday, Aug. 21, reopening by 5 a.m. the following morning. During the closures, traffic will detour via Baxley Road and County Road 220.

Southbound Blanding Boulevard from Branan Field Road to the First Coast Expressway southbound off-ramp to Blanding Boulevard will close at 11 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 22, reopening by 5 a.m. Friday, Aug. 23. During the closure, traffic will detour via Baxley Road and County Road 220.
