Ramp Closures on I-10, Hammond Boulevard and I-295 Scheduled Sept. 8 to Sept. 12

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of a resurfacing project on I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295, drivers can expect nighttime ramp closures Sunday, Sept. 8 through Thursday, Sept. 12 for milling and resurfacing. The following closures are planned from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting:

- Sunday, Sept. 8 to Tuesday, Sept. 10, the southbound I-295 ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed. Drivers on I-295 will take I-10 eastbound to Lane Avenue to access I-10 westbound.
- Sunday, Sept. 8 to Tuesday, Sept. 10, the westbound I-10 ramp to Hammond Boulevard will be closed. Drivers on I-10 will continue on I-10 to Chaffee Road and access I-10 eastbound to exit to Hammond Boulevard.
- Tuesday, Sept. 10 to Thursday, Sept. 12, the Hammond Boulevard ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed. Drivers on Hammond Boulevard will take U.S. 90 (Beaver Street) west to Chaffee Road and go south on Chaffee Road to access I-10 westbound

During the closures, drivers should follow posted detour signage and use additional caution in the area.
