Ramp from San Pablo Road to Westbound Butler Boulevard to Close Overnight Starting May 2

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s interchange improvement project at J.T. Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) and San Pablo Road, the ramp from San Pablo Road to westbound Butler Boulevard will close nightly from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. Sunday, May 2 through Thursday, May 6.

Detour: To access westbound Butler Boulevard, drivers will be detoured to eastbound Butler Boulevard, where they will continue to the South Beach Parkway exit and turn left onto South Beach Parkway to access the ramp onto westbound Butler Boulevard.
