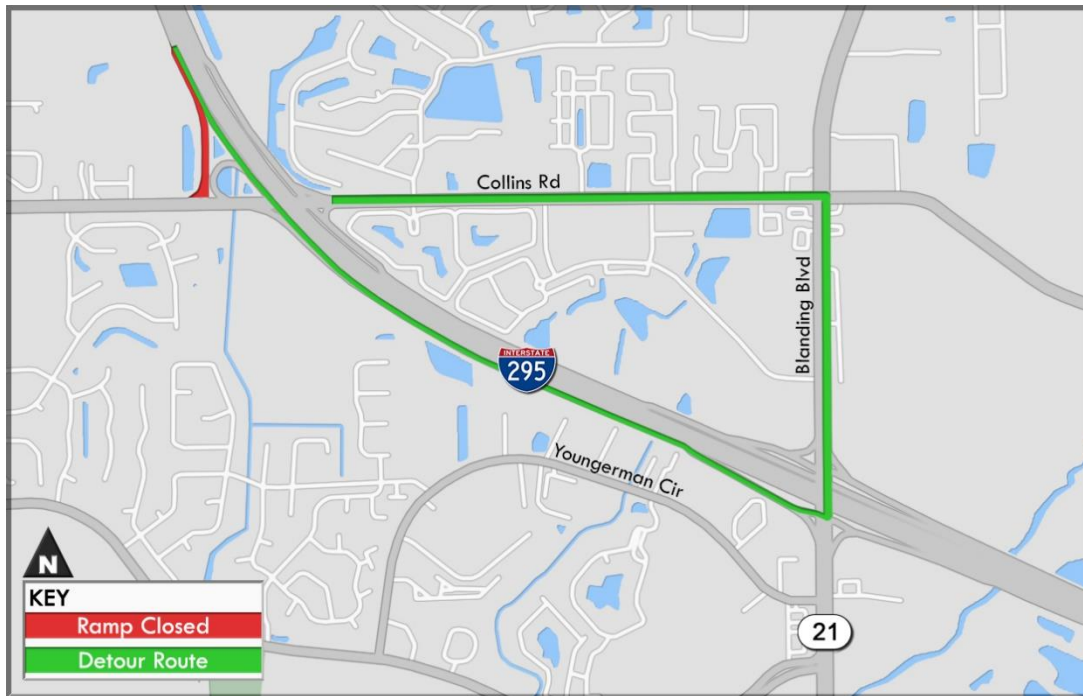

Southbound I-295 Ramp to Collins Road to Close Overnight June 27

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s interchange improvement project at I-295 and Collins Road, the ramp from southbound I-295 to Collins Road will close overnight beginning at 10 p.m. on Sunday, June 27. The ramp will reopen by 5 a.m. on Monday, June 28. Southbound I-295 traffic will continue to the Blanding Boulevard exit and travel north on Blanding Boulevard to access Collins Road (shown in the map below).
