Southside Connector at Regency Square Boulevard North Overnight Ramp Closures Scheduled September 12 through September 14

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Southside Connector (State Road 113) northbound and southbound ramps at Regency Square Boulevard North are scheduled to close from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Sunday, September 12 through Tuesday, September 14, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The closures are necessary for guardrail work associated with the Southside Connector resurfacing and improvement project.

Sunday, September 12: The northbound on-ramp to Southside Connector from Regency Square Boulevard North will close at 7 p.m. and reopen by 7 a.m. Monday. Southside Connector northbound traffic will detour to Monument Road and Tredinick Parkway to access Southside Connector northbound. (Closure and detour shown in Map 1 below.)



Monday, September 13: The Southside Connector southbound on-ramp from Regency Square Boulevard North will close at 7 p.m. and reopen by 7 a.m. Tuesday. Southbound Southside Connector traffic will detour via the Southside Connector Service roads (north and south) to and from Tredinick Parkway to access Southside Connector southbound. (Closure and detour shown in Map 2 below.)

Tuesday, September 14: The Southside Connector northbound off-ramp to Regency Square Boulevard North will close at 7 p.m. and reopen by 7 a.m. Wednesday. Traffic will detour north on Southside Connector to Tredinick Parkway to access Regency Square Boulevard North via the southbound Southside Connector Service Road. (Closure and detour shown in Map 3 below.)
