

Southside Connector at Regency Square Boulevard North Ramp Daytime Closures Scheduled September 8 and September 9

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Southside Connector (State Road 113) northbound ramp from Regency Square Boulevard North is scheduled to close from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Wednesday, September 8 and Thursday, September 9, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The closures are necessary for construction associated with the Southside Connector resurfacing and improvement project.

Southside Connector northbound traffic will detour to Monument Road and Tredinick Parkway to access Southside Connector northbound. (Closure and detour shown in map below.)



Signage will direct motorists through the detour. Motorists on Southside Connector will not be impacted.
