### **Travel Advisory: State Road 200 Lane Closure Schedule**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – This advisory is to inform community leaders and interested parties about upcoming scheduled lane closures, traffic shifts and other construction activity. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has permitted as part of the State Road 200/A1A improvement projects.

Below are the planned closures for December 18 through January 3, weather permitting. Certain activities may require unexpected lane closures for the safety of both drivers and construction workers. #### **Notable**

Limited activities will take place along the corridor over the next two weeks, as some construction activities will be restricted. FDOT Officials and Construction Inspectors will monitor traffic volumes and adjust construction activities as needed throughout the holiday season to limit the impact to traffic. The next lane closure report will be issued until January 8, 2021.

#### **Daytime lane closures**

##### **State Road 200:**

- The eastbound right lane of State Road 200 from Ruben Davis Lane to the Lofton Creek Bridge is expected to be closed Saturday, December 20 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

##### **I-95:**

- One inside lane of I-95 northbound from one mile south of the State Road 2000 off-ramp to State Road 200 is expected to be closed Monday, December 21 and Tuesday, December 22 from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. No ramps will be impacted.
