Travel Advisory: State Road 200 Lane Closure Schedule

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – This advisory is to inform community leaders and interested parties about upcoming scheduled lane closures, traffic shifts and other construction activity. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has permitted as part of the State Road 200/A1A improvement projects.

Below are the planned closures for January 8 to January 15, weather permitting. Certain activities may require unexpected lane closures for the safety of both drivers and construction workers. Notable: While unrelated to the construction projects underway along the corridor, the westbound outside lane of the Shave Bridge over the Amelia River will see a closure Wednesday, January 13 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for routine bridge maintenance.

As construction moves toward its final stages, it is important to remember weather and temperatures can impact construction progress. This is especially true regarding temperature-sensitive materials when activities are predominately taking place at night. We appreciate the public's patience and understanding.

Daytime lane closures

State Road 200:

- The eastbound right lane of State Road 200 from east of I-95 to Harper Chapel Road is expected to be closed Saturday, January 9 from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

I-95: None at this time.

Nighttime lane closures

State Road 200:

- The eastbound right lane of State Road 200 from Chester Road to Flora Parke Boulevard is expected to be closed Sunday, January 10 and Monday, January 11 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
