UPDATE I-95 South Detour Postponed, I-95 North Detour Near Downtown Remains on Schedule for Tomorrow Night

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of bridge construction activities for the Florida Department of Transportation's I-10/I-95 Operational Improvements project, a detour of I-95 north at the Fuller Warren Bridge is scheduled for tomorrow night. The I-95 south detour previously scheduled for tonight has been postponed until further notice.

I-95 North Detour: Saturday, July 17 from 11 p.m. to 8:30 a.m., I-95 north will be detoured between Emerson Street and Forest Street, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. Drivers on I-95 north will be detoured to the Acosta Bridge, right on Broad Street and left on Adams Street to reconnect with I-95 north. Drivers who wish to connect with I-10 will take I-95 south to connect with I-10 (see map below).
