UPDATE: County Road 209 Closure Postponed Until May 24

CLAY COUNTY, Fla. – The overnight closure of County Road 209 previously scheduled for tonight has been postponed due to unforeseen circumstances. The rescheduled closure is expected to begin at 9 p.m. Monday, May 24, with the roadway reopening by 5 a.m. Tuesday, May 25. The closure will allow crews to safely complete concrete deck-pouring activities.

During the closure, motorists will be detoured via U.S. 17, J.P. Hall Boulevard and County Road 226 as shown in the map below.
