Westbound I-10 at Lane Avenue to See Detour, Traffic Shift Friday and Sunday Overnight

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT's I-10 from I-295 to I-95 widening project, I-10 west will be detoured Friday, October 7 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. and again Sunday, October 9 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

The detours are necessary to allow crews to switch traffic from its current alignment to newly constructed roadway over Lane Avenue. Crews will also perform pavement griding operations overnight Sunday.

Drivers on westbound I-10 will be detoured to Lane Avenue, turn left on Commonwealth Avenue, and continue to I-295 south where motorists may continue on I-10 toward their destination. Drivers on Lane Avenue seeking to travel on I-10 will use Normandy Boulevard to northbound I-295 and continue toward I-10. Signage will direct motorists throughout the detour.

Superior Construction was awarded the \$174.5 million contract to widen I-10 between I-295 and I-95. The project is expected to be completed in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

October is National Pedestrian Safety Month, and all roadway users share the responsibility for keeping everyone safe. Pedestrians should always use designated crosswalks and avoid distractions like using cell phones while walking. Motorists must yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and watch for pedestrians at all times. Together, we can reach the goal of ZERO pedestrian fatalities on Florida's roads.
