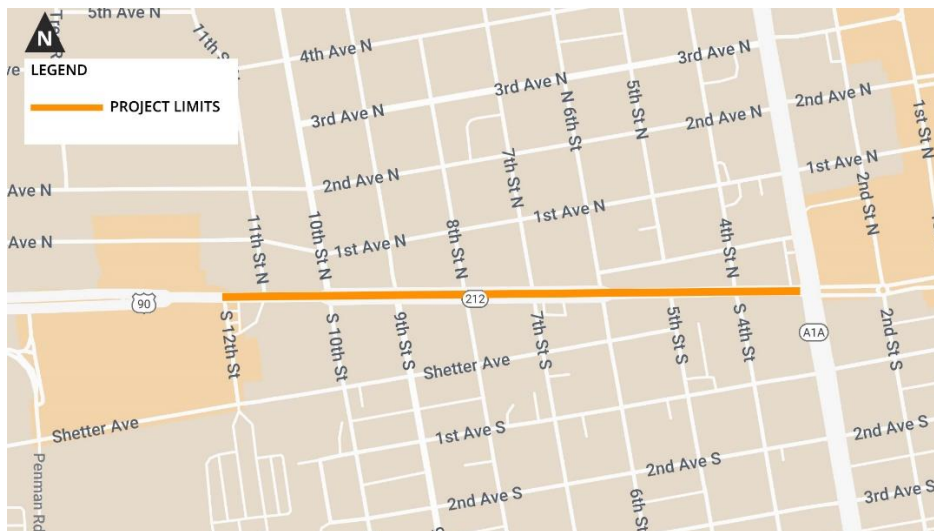

Beach Boulevard Resurfacing Project Begins This Week

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Construction on a project to resurface Beach Boulevard (State Road 212) from 12th Street to State Road A1A begins this week.

Watson Civil Construction, Inc. was selected to complete this \$4 million project, which includes milling and resurfacing, base work, drainage improvements, curb and gutter, traffic signals and highway signing installation, sidewalk improvements and other incidental construction. The project is scheduled to be completed next fall.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. No lane closures will be allowed from 8 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday through Sunday. Workers will always maintain sidewalk space for pedestrians on one side of Beach Boulevard. Existing businesses in work areas will be provided with adequate entrances for vehicle and pedestrian traffic.
