Detours Planned Next Week for Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway (SR 115) ITS Improvements

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements project on Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway (State Road 115) from Boulevard Street to Beach Boulevard, daytime detours are scheduled Monday, June 24 through Wednesday, June 26 for power service installations.

MLK On-ramp from Boulevard Street Detour

The Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway on-ramp from Boulevard Street will be detoured Monday, June 24 and Tuesday, June 25 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. for power service installations.

As a detour, drivers will take Boulevard Street, southbound, then eastbound to West 19th Street, take a left onto North Pearl Street and then make a right onto the eastbound MLK on-ramp.

Eastbound Beach Boulevard at East Road Detour

Eastbound lanes of Beach Boulevard will be detoured Tuesday, June 25 and Wednesday, June 26 from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. for power service installations.

As a detour, drivers will take the eastbound Beach Boulevard exit to East Road, turn left onto Parental Home Road and then make a right turn onto Beach Boulevard.

Chinchor Electric began the \$7.9 million Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements in September 2023 and is estimated to complete the work by early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
