### **Detours Planned Next Week for Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway (SR 115) ITS Improvements**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of the Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements project on Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway (State Road 115) from Boulevard Street to Beach Boulevard, detours are scheduled during the day Tuesday, June 18 through Friday, June 21 for installation of an ITS conduit bore under the roadway.

#### **Northbound Haines Street between Marshall Street and Jessie Street Road Detour**

Haines Street, northbound, between Marshall Street and Jessie Street will be closed starting Tuesday, June 18 through Friday, June 21 from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. for installation of an ITS conduit bore under MLK.

As a detour, drivers will take Haines Street, northbound, turn right onto Marshall Street, turn left onto Talleyrand Avenue, turn left onto Jessie Street, then make a right turn onto Haines Street.

Chinchor Electric began the \$7.9 million Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements in September 2023 and is estimated to complete the work by early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
