ICYMI: FDOT to Host May 23 Construction Open House for State Road 211 Resurfacing from San Juan Avenue to I-95 Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will host a construction open house Thursday, May 23 for the State Road 211 Resurfacing from San Juan Avenue to I-95 project.

Interested parties are invited to drop by FDOT Jacksonville Urban Office Training Center, located at 2198 Edison Avenue, Jacksonville, FL 32204, from 4:30 to 6 p.m. The informal open house will give the public the opportunity to learn about upcoming construction and discuss details with members of the project team. In addition to milling and resurfacing, project improvements include shoulder treatment, sidewalks and ADA curb upgrades, new bike lanes and shared-use lane markings, signals, highway signage, traffic calming features and pedestrian lighting upgrades.
