Lane Avenue at CSX Railroad near Beaver Street (U.S. 90)

to see Emergency Closure Tomorrow

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – CSX Transportation has notified the Florida Department of Transportation about a necessary closure at the intersection of Lane Avenue and CSX Railroad to take place from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Tuesday, May 7.

The railroad crossing is located between Beaver Street (U.S. 90) and Highway Avenue.

CSX Transportation crews will implement a full detour of Lane Avenue at Beaver Street (U.S. 90) to perform emergency repairs to the driving surface.

Southbound Lane Avenue:

Motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists seeking to travel south on Lane Avenue will be detoured east on Beaver Street (U.S. 90), turn south on Edgewood Avenue South and turn west on Highway Avenue where they will continue to their destination.

Northbound Lane Avenue:

Motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists seeking to travel north on Lane Avenue will be detoured west on Highway Avenue, turn north on Edgewood Avenue South and turn west on Beaver Street (U.S. 90) where they will continue to their destination.

Motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists are advised to plan their routes accordingly and allow extra travel time.
