Nightly Detours of Emerson Expressway to Extend Hours on May 30

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) continues the Emerson Expressway (State Road 228A) resurfacing project, regularly scheduled northbound and southbound nightly detours will extend on Thursday, May 30 until 11 a.m. The extension from 6:30 a.m. to 11 a.m. is required to enhance the safety of motorists, pedestrians and service personnel while inspections are performed.

Motorists are encouraged to seek alternate routes and allow extra time to reach their destinations.

The following detours are ongoing as part of the project:

<u>Southbound Emerson Expressway:</u> A nightly detour of southbound Emerson Expressway from 6:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. that extends until 11 a.m. on Thursday, May 30.

Northbound Emerson Expressway: A nightly detour of northbound Emerson Expressway from 6:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. that extends until 11 a.m. on Thursday, May 30.

De Moya Highway Infrastructure was awarded the \$10.3 million project. Work is expected to be completed in fall 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Roadway improvements as part of this project include milling and resurfacing, shoulder treatments, drainage improvements, curb and gutter treatment, guardrail work and the rehabilitation of concrete along portions of the roadway.
