### **Overnight Ramp Closures at I-10 and U.S. 301 Interchange Planned July 18**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The I-10 westbound ramp to U.S. 301 and the ramp from U.S. 301 to westbound I-10 will be closed for resurfacing from 7 p.m. Thursday, July 18 to 5 a.m. Friday, July 19, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. During the closures, the following detours will be in place:

- Drivers on I-10 westbound will take the First Coast Expressway north to U.S. 90 west to access U.S. 301.
- Drivers on U.S. 301 will take U.S. 90 west to State Road 121 south to access I-10.
- An alternate detour for drivers on U.S. 301 southbound will be to continue on U.S. 301 to State Road 228 north to access I-10.

Hubbard Construction Company was selected to complete this resurfacing project at a cost of \$19 million by summer 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. Please note the speed limit on I-10 will be reduced to 60 mph during lane closures.
