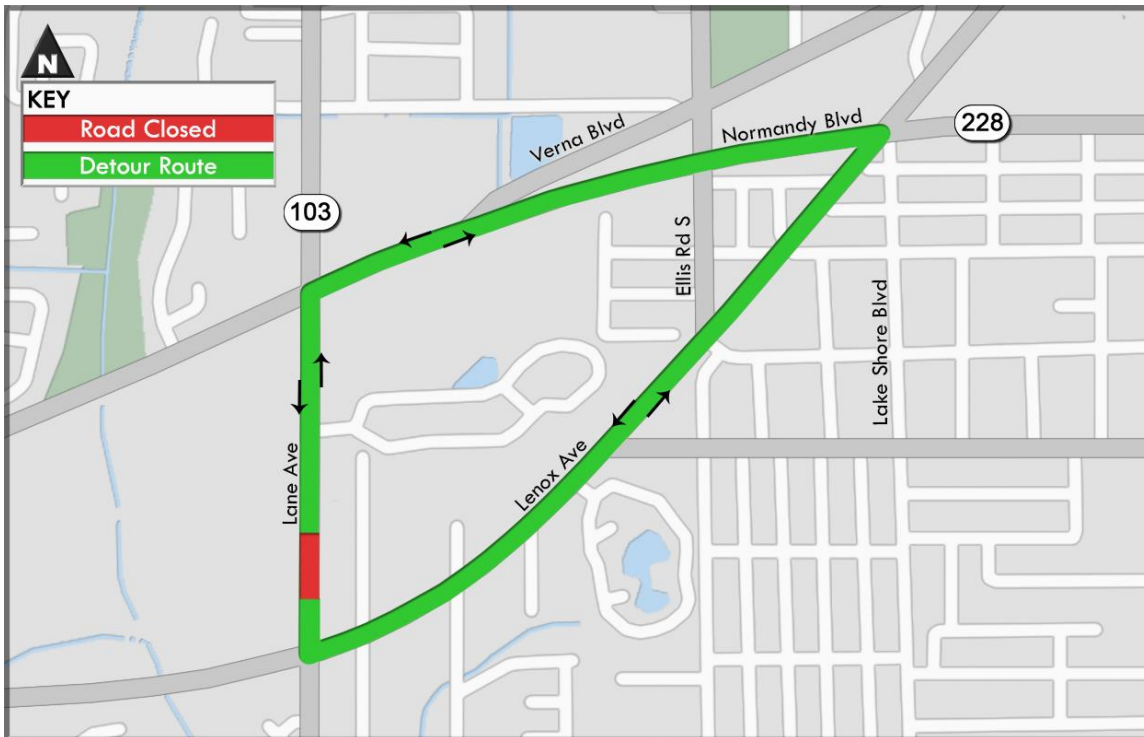

Overnight Closure Planned August 7 at Lane Avenue, Lenox Avenue Intersection

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT’s Lane Avenue resurfacing project, a section of Lane Avenue north of the intersection with Lenox Avenue will be closed for overnight utility work from 8 p.m. Sunday, August 7 to 6:30 a.m. Monday, August 8, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Northbound Lane Avenue Traffic: Drivers will turn right onto Lenox Avenue, left onto Normandy Boulevard and proceed to Lane Avenue.

Southbound Lane Avenue Traffic: Drivers will turn left onto Normandy Boulevard, right onto Lenox Avenue and proceed to Lane Avenue.
