### Overnight Closures on San Pablo Road Ramp to Westbound Butler Boulevard Rescheduled for September 26, September 30

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Due to weather, overnight ramp closures on the San Pablo Road ramp to westbound Butler Boulevard have been rescheduled for Sunday, September 26 and Thursday, September 30.

The ramp will close at 8 p.m. Sunday, September 26 to allow for installation of new pavement markings. When the ramp reopens at 5 a.m. Monday, September 27, traffic will be shifted onto new asphalt. The ramp will close again 8 p.m. Thursday, September 30 through 5 a.m. Friday, October 30 for barrier wall relocation.

During the closures, traffic will be detoured eastbound on Butler Boulevard to the South Beach Parkway exit, where motorists can access westbound Butler Boulevard.
