Overnight Detours on U.S. 301 and I-10 Scheduled Dec. 15

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the I-10 and U.S. 301 interchange improvement project, roadway closures on U.S. 301 at I-10 are scheduled Dec. 15 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and schedule permitting. These overnight closures are necessary to set the deck concrete for the I-10 westbound bridge over U.S. 301.

The following detours will be in place to facilitate this work activity:

- Drivers who wish to exit on U.S. 301 southbound from I-10 westbound will be detoured to State Road 228 (Exit 336) and take I-10 east to U.S. 301.
- Drivers who wish to exit on U.S. 301 northbound from I-10 eastbound will be detoured to State Road 23 (Exit 350B) to Beaver Street westbound.
- Drivers on northbound U.S. 301 south of I-10 will be detoured onto I-10 eastbound to State Road 23 (Exit 350B) to Beaver Street westbound.
- Drivers on southbound U.S. 301 north of I-10 will be detoured onto I-10 westbound to State Road 228 (Exit 336) and take I-10 east to U.S. 301.

Superior Construction Company began the \$65 million interchange improvement project in late February 2016 and is estimated to complete the work in summer 2023, weather and schedule permitting.
