Ramp Closures on Eastbound I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295 Scheduled July 15 to July 22

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Drivers can expect nightly ramp closures on I-10 from Chaffee Road to I-295 Monday, July 15 through Monday, July 22 for milling and resurfacing. Nightly closures are expected from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. the following morning, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Monday, July 15 and Tuesday, July 16, the Chaffee Road ramp to westbound I-10 will be closed. Drivers on Chaffee Road will continue north to U.S. 90 west (Beaver Street) and take southbound First Coast Expressway (SR 23) to access I-10.

Tuesday, July 16 and Wednesday, July 17, the westbound I-10 ramp to Chaffee Road will be closed. Drivers will continue west on I-10, exit northbound First Coast Expressway to U.S. 90 (Beaver Street) and take U.S. 90 east to access I-10.

Wednesday, July 17 and Thursday, July 18, the Chaffee Road ramp to eastbound I-10 will be closed. Northbound Chaffee Road drivers will continue north to U.S. 90 and take U.S. 90 east to Hammond Boulevard to access I-10.

Sunday, July 21 and Monday, July 22, the eastbound I-10 ramp to Chaffee Road will be closed. Drivers will continue eastbound on I-10 to Hammond Road north then west on U.S. 90 to access Chaffee Road.

Anderson Columbia was awarded the \$26 million project to complete resurfacing on I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295. This project is expected to be completed by mid-2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
