South Edgewood Avenue and Roosevelt Boulevard Street and Ramp Closures Planned May 4 through May 10

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of Edgewood Avenue South roundabout construction, Edgewood Avenue between Mayflower Avenue and Plymouth Street will close nightly Sunday, May 5 through Thursday, May 9 for paving activities.

The roadway will close at 9 p.m. each night and reopen by 6 a.m. the following morning. During these closures, any vehicles parked on Edgewood Avenue between Mayflower Avenue and Plymouth Street will be towed. The nighttime resurfacing work will not affect the current daytime detours, which will continue on northbound Edgewood Avenue at Roosevelt Boulevard (U.S. 17) for median construction and other improvements for approximately 3 weeks, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Additionally, the westbound Roosevelt Boulevard off-ramp to Edgewood Avenue and eastbound Roosevelt Boulevard off-ramp to Edgewood Avenue will experience closures Monday, May 6 through Friday, May 10 for bridge cleaning and painting.

The ramp from westbound Roosevelt Boulevard will close 24 hours a day during weekdays but will reopen from 5 p.m. Friday to 9 a.m. Monday. The westbound detour to Edgewood north goes right on McDuff Avenue and left on Post Street to Edgewood Avenue. The westbound detour to Edgewood south goes left on McDuff Avenue and right on Remington Street to Edgewood.

The eastbound Roosevelt Boulevard off-ramp to Edgewood Avenue will close from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays but reopen nights and weekends. The eastbound detour to Edgewood south goes right on McDuff Avenue and right on Remington Street to Edgewood Avenue. The Edgewood north detour goes left on McDuff Avenue and left on Post Street to Edgewood Avenue.
